

How Likely Is It For My Child’s Chronic Conditions To Be Reversed?

The following table is to show you what conditions are most likely, or likely, or challengingly to be reversed. (Note: It is not an exhaustive list. The report is based on the World Health Organization 2012 report, pubmed.gov, clinicaltrials.gov, peer review journals and weMED Clinical results. The report has not been evaluated by FDA. Please consult with your healthcare professional for further information).

Points of attention:

- 1) All acute fever, pain, cough, and diarrhea need to be seen by a physician or healthcare professional to identify the causes, since fever, fluid loss, and infection could be very dangerous.
